Tenure, Quorum & Meeting Frequency:

1. The tenure of membership of the above-mentioned committee shall be three years from the date of notification.
2. The quorum for each BOS meeting shall be not less than 2/3 (two-thirds) of the total strength of the Board.
3. The meetings of the BOS shall be organized at least twice a year.

CONSTITUTION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES (BoS)

The Board of Studies (BoS) is an academic body responsible for planning and shaping the academic framework of an institution. Its primary functions include reviewing and updating courses to align with industry and academic requirements and introducing new courses as necessary.

1. General

- a) The Board of Studies shall function for a term of three (03) years and shall continue to operate until it is formally reconstituted.
- b) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the competent authority for constituting or reconstituting the Board of Studies.

2. Composition of The Board of Studies (BoS)

	A minimum of two (02) subject experts (a combination of academicians, industry experts, and laboratory researchers) per discipline, nominated by the Dean. The experts should preferably be drawn from: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Reputed academic institutions such as IISc, IITs, NITs, IIMs, NLUs, IIITs, and other leading universities. ○ Renowned R&D organizations such as CSIR, DRDO, etc. ○ Established industries with significant contributions to academia.
	One alumnus, co-opted by the BOS and nominated by the Dean.
	A minimum of one (01) student, nominated by the Dean based on merit, shall serve as a special invitee. The student will participate in meetings relevant to student-related agenda items.

3. Meetings

- a) The BOS shall convene at least twice a year.
- b) The Chairperson shall preside over the meetings. In the absence of the Chairperson, the BOS members may nominate a senior member to chair the meeting.
- c) The Chairperson shall be responsible for preparing the agenda and circulating it to all members at least 15 days prior to the scheduled meeting.
- d) The quorum for a BOS meeting shall be at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total strength of the Board.
- e) The Chairperson shall prepare and circulate the minutes of each meeting to all concerned members.

4. Functions

The Board of Studies shall have the authority to:

- a) Recommend course structures for various academic programs to the Academic Council for approval.
- b) Propose modifications to syllabi and course content as needed and submit them to the Academic Council for approval.
- c) Suggest audit courses to enhance students' skills and knowledge.
- d) Formulate basic rules, regulations, and minimum eligibility criteria for admission into the university's academic programs.
- e) Recommend new academic programs and specializations, as deemed necessary.

All BOS recommendations shall be submitted to the Chairperson of the Academic Council for final approval.

5. Decision by Circulation

- a) In urgent situations, the Chairperson (BOS) may seek members' opinions via the circulation of proposals.
- b) The outcomes of such circulated decisions, along with the actions taken, shall be communicated to all BOS members.
- c) The Academic Council shall review and approve the circulated recommendations.
- d) In exceptional circumstances, the Chairperson (BOS) may directly recommend an issue to the Academic Council and report the matter to the BOS subsequently.
